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### **COURT ADMINISTRATION DIVISION RESUMES OPERATIONS AT 25 DOMINICA DRIVE**

**Kingston, Jamaica —** Court Administration Division (CAD) on December 12 resumed operations on the 8th Floor, 25 Dominica Drive, Kingston 5, after one year of operating from the Court of Appeal building in Downtown Kingston. The administrative arm of the Judiciary had temporarily relocated following damage sustained to the Dominica Drive building during the passage of Hurricane Beryl.

The divisions returning to Dominica Drive include the Executive Unit, Legal Services, Strategic Planning, Client Services and Communications, Internal Audit, Procurement, and the Software Department within the Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Division. These units have resumed full operations and remain committed to delivering efficient service to internal and external stakeholders.

Mrs. Kadiesh Jarrett-Fletcher, Director of Client Services, Communications and Information for the Court Administration Division, stated that the return to Dominica Drive represents a significant step toward operational normalization and enhanced service delivery. “We are committed to maintaining accessibility, efficiency, and seamless support to the judiciary and the public. Our teams remain fully mobilized across both locations to ensure a smooth experience for all users of our services.”

Other key divisions, including Accounts, additional ICT operations, and several administrative units, will continue to operate from Downtown Kingston until further notice.
